The Disneyland Hotel is holding a block of rooms for conference participants at the conference rate of \$139 single or double occupancy, plus a Resort Fee, plus tax. Rooms are being held until November 7, 2006. After that date, the conference rate may not be available.

This rate is available for 3 days before and 3 days after the conference.

The Resort Fee includes self-parking, unlimited local and 800 calls, high-speed Internet access, use of the fitness center.

To cancel reservations made at the Disneyland Hotel, the hotel requires 72 hours advance notice.

Disneyland Theme Parks are open every day. Conference participants may purchase discounted tickets – multi-day tickets, full day or Twilight.

GROUND TRANSPORTATION AND PARKING

Transportation between John Wayne Orange County Airport and the Disneyland Hotel is available by taxi for approximately \$40 or by Super Shuttle (1-800-258-3826 or www.supershuttle.com) for approximately \$20.

For hotel guests, self-parking is included. For conference registrants who drive in each day, the discounted parking rate is \$10/day. Valet parking is an additional \$12/day.

Disneyland Park, Downtown Disney District, and Disney's California Adventure Park are all within walking distance of the hotel. Downtown Disney District includes restaurants and shops, a movie theatre, and live music spots.
